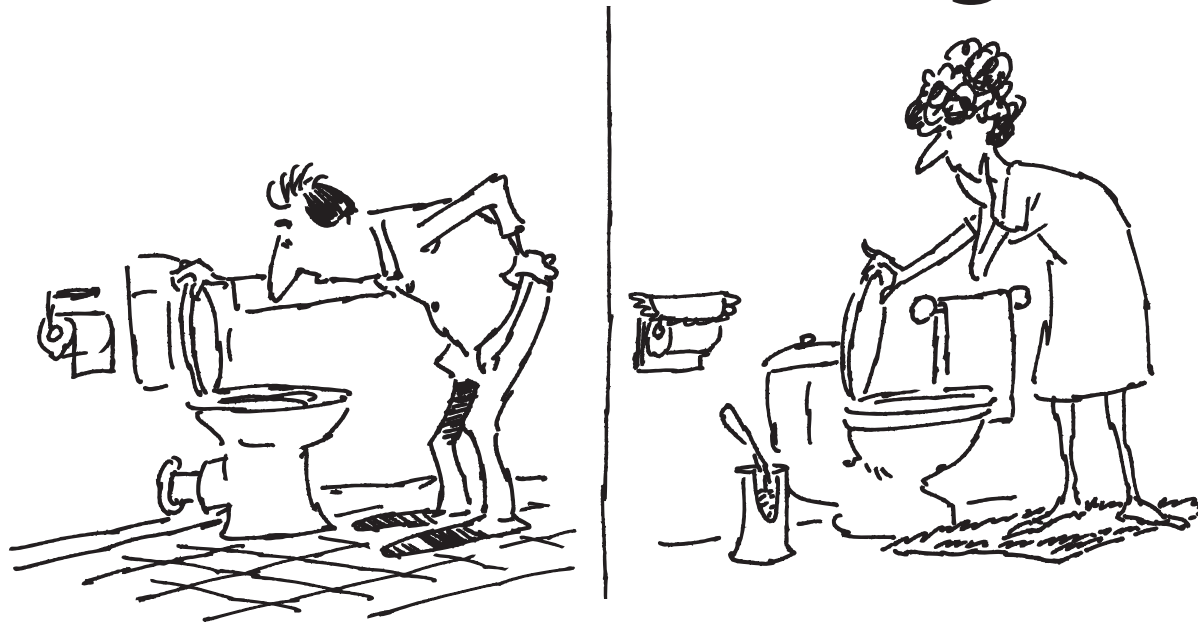


Bowel cancer kills 80 Australians every week.



That's why we're asking you to do this.

Nearly all bowel cancers can be cured if found early. Screening for bowel cancer is easy. It involves doing a simple test in the privacy of your own home.

If you're over 50, speak to your doctor about regular testing. If you turn 50, 55 or 65 before 31 December 2010, the National Bowel Cancer Screening Program will be sending a test kit to you in the mail.

The Cancer Council recommends screening for bowel cancer every two years from the age of 50. Because bowel cancer often develops without symptoms, doing this simple test could save your life.
